RE: Update for the 15<sup>th</sup> Foxburg Hickory Championship.

Mike Campailla (Malvern OH) and Gary Cole, (Tampa FL). Bob Mirt (Pittsburg PA) was our 15<sup>th</sup> entry. The 15<sup>th</sup> entry of our 15<sup>th</sup> year earns him 3 line cut golf balls. Our compliments and a toast to the entrants from Wisconsin. The Badger State will be well represented again in 2023.

We have received twenty entries as of May 4. If you are planning on attending, you will want to get your entry in or at least let us know your plans. We have opened entries to anyone and already have a couple of first-time entrants. Drop us an email if you have any questions.

#### **ENTRY FEE**

The entry fee for 2022 is \$275 (\$225 for long distance Foxburg Country Club members, \$175 for local members). The entry DOES NOT include the cost of golf balls. You will find more on golf balls for 2023 below.





### **GOLF BALLS**

Announcing a change in golf balls permitted for this year.

Open Division entrants are expected to play with the Park model, line cut or bramble, supplied by the McIntyre Golf Company. We are aware several of you are experimenting making period balls from similar material. We encourage you to continue, although examples will need approved for tournament play.

All other divisions, including the Post-1900 division will use the Braid or Vardon model ball produced by the McIntyre Golf Ball Company. These are both limited flight balls. We expect all contestants to play from the cut stone tee boxes, it makes sense to use the early style and restricted ball from those distances.

Golf balls can be ordered at the time you submit your entry. I will have an update of the cost in the next email. When ordering Parks, please note if you prefer line cut, brambles, or a mixture. Contact the McIntyre Golf Company Mcintyre Golf Company to order balls directly.

#### CART RENTAL

We have always encouraged power carts at the FHC. We felt it enabled many long-tenured hickory nuts to enjoy the course and comradery. In our previous years we included the cost of the cart in the event fees. They are not included this year; contestants will need to rent their cart from the pro shop.

Other than the noted changes, the routine for the 2023 looks to be very similar to previous years. I have inserted the expected itinerary at the bottom of this email to help understand the events and timing.





#### **ACCOMODATIONS**

We have secured the Quality Inn in Clarion as the 'tournament hotel' again this year. Our agreement is \$75 per night. The direct line to the hotel is 814-226-5230. The hotel has been very accommodating when booking directly through them. We suggest you do so if intending to stay there. Mention Foxburg Hickory Golf for the group rate. There are other lodging options in the Clarion and local Foxburg area, including the Foxburg Inn, large hotel chains, local B & B and VRBO choices.

Golf club sales are encouraged, generally there is room on the porch if you have a few clubs you would like to sell or barter, playable clubs have always done well.
