## **North Adelaide Golf Course (North Course)**

**NORTH

In September 1895, golf was first played in Adelaide's northwest parkland opposite 'Montefiore', the home of prominent Adelaide solicitor William Pope. The rough-and-ready 9-hole course was colloquially known as 'Willy Pope's Links'. Prompted by increased council regulation of parkland usage, the North Adelaide Golf Club was officially formed a decade later, in 1905. Unsurprisingly, William Pope was the club's inaugural president. Scottish-Australian professional Edgar C. Martin was commissioned to design the initial 18-hole course, then known as 'Montefiore Links'. In 1922, the Adelaide City Council took over and ran the links as a public facility, to which the North Adelaide Golf Club received priority. Part of the deal was for the council to develop a second 18-hole course. Designed by local golfing prodigy Rufus Stewart, the No. 2 course is now known as the North Course.

# Australian Hickory Shaft Championships – Event Conditions

## Australian Hickory Shaft Open Championships (Men's and Women's)

A 36-hole individual stroke-play event played over two days at The Royal Adelaide Golf Club – Monday 13 & Tuesday 14 October 2025.

## Australian Hickory Shaft Foursomes Championship (Unisex)

An 18-hole Canadian foursomes stroke-play event played at North Adelaide Golf Course (North Course) – Sunday 12 October 2025.

### Eligibility

The events are open to amateurs and PGA members (or international equivalent).

### Rules

- Current R&A rules of golf
- Local rules of the host club
- Mercy rule – maximum of ten strokes on any hole

### Registration

- Competitors must register 30 minutes prior to their allotted tee time

### Clubs, balls, etc.

- See: [AGHS Hickory Event Conditions of Play](#)

### Distance Measuring Devices

- Not permitted

### Motorised Carts

- Permitted – player to arrange through Pro Shop

### Match Committee

- Les Browne, Andrew Baker, Kim Hastie and Phil Baird

### Rulings

- Decisions of the match committee shall be final

### Handicaps

Golf Australia handicap (or international equivalent) with the following adjustments:

Players whose Golf Australia handicap (or international equivalent) has been achieved primarily with hickory clubs – to use their Golf Australia handicap (or international equivalent)

Players with a valid hickory handicap (DotGolf, HGQ or SoHG – with a minimum of ten submitted cards) – to use that handicap

Players without a Golf Australia handicap (or international equivalent) or a valid hickory handicap – to play off scratch

### Ties

- *For the individual championships (only)* – ties for first place will be decided by sudden death playoff
- *For all other events* – ties will be decided by countback using the Golf Australia Australian Countback Method

### For all events

- Period golfing attire is encouraged
- Basic hickory sets are available for free loan
- After-round refreshments are at own expense
- Entries close Friday 19 September 2025

### Reciprocal agreements

Competitors whose home clubs have reciprocal agreements with RAGC are responsible for making the appropriate arrangements.

The Course: Rated among the top 50 courses nationwide, Port Fairy Golf Links winds its way over an imposing natural dune system adjacent to Port Fairy Bay. While appearing to be age-old, the links opened in 1963 as a member-designed, nine-hole layout. In 1985, the course was extended to eighteen holes to a design by 1958 Australian Amateur Champion Kevin Hartley. Since 2000, a later winner of the Australian Amateur Championship, Mike Clayton (1978), has been advising the club on course design and conditioning.
